## How to use this price list:

1. Only track the prices of 5-10 items that you buy most often.
2. Focus only on the stores you visit the most
3. Compare prices with the unit price.

- Each store sells a different size of the item you're purchasing, so knowing the unit price will help you figure out the best price.
- To figure out the unit price, divide the price by the unit measure. For example, $\$ 24.99$ divided by 20 pounds = $\$ 1.25$ per pound

4. Highlight the store with the lowest price so you can quickly see it
